- 2. Any resident or visitor wishing to address the Board, an individual Board member or a guest presenter, must direct their questions and comments to the President at the appropriate time or at the President's invitation.
- 3. The Board will hear a resident's or visitors comments only after the President has recognized the individual to speak.
- 4. Speakers are asked to state their name for the public record.
- 5. Speakers will be allowed three minutes and may not yield their time to other speakers.
- 6. Persons wishing to speak for a second time may do so with the consent of the President, only after all others have had an opportunity to address the Board.
- 7. Please refrain from comment or question at a Public Hearing until the presentation has been completed.
- 8. At the discretion of the Chair, you may be asked to submit your question in writing on a 3 x 5 card and you will receive a written response with one week of the hearing.

The President will strive to allow all residents and visitors equal opportunity to address the Board. In general the Board will not comment or respond to issues requiring Board consideration until the issue has been reviewed by the Board/staff.

The Board often has a full business agenda and must complete the work of the Park District at scheduled meetings. Please do not repeat comments or questions that have already been made by others and please do not interrupt commissioners or other speakers.









Operating Capitals March 2022









Golf Course Superintendent; Ania Cramer; Community Outreach/Business Development; Libby Baker, Office Associate

Commissioner Lussen made a motion to allow remote participation by Commissioner Codo. Commissioner Archambault seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Ayes: Archambault, James, Lussen, Rapp, Root, Seaman Nays: None Motion carried

CHANGES TO THE AGENDA

None

COMMUNICATIONS

Executive Director Peterson commented on the cancellation of a tennis event intended to raise funds for the people of Ukraine. He noted several emails were received questioning the reason for the cancellation. He explained most local governments are prohibited from soliciting donations in support of a political effort.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Lakefront Update

Director Kutulas reported responses are being prepared for the comments and questions received from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources regarding the Elder + Centennial permit application. The Army Corps of Engineers has registered the application but not

made comments.

Commissioners Root and Rapp stated they do not recollect a detailed review or formal discussion of the plan design by the Board. The details of previous meetings related to Elder + Centennial and the design process were discussed.

Following discussion, it was determined a special meeting would be held at 5:00 pm, March 24, 2022. The design plan will be presented and discussed. The louver model will be available for viewing. In the meantime, Director Kutulas will put a string line up at the beach to replicate the sight lines.

Commissioner Root asked to receive copies of the permit application as it is updated.

Golf Operations

Golf Manager Johnson described the budget exercise undertaken by staff to reduce expenses and increase revenue. He noted revenue will be limited during the 2022 and 2023 seasons due to the closure but explained some expenses will continue to be incurred to maintain areas of the course not affected by the construction. Superintendent McCann reviewed the projects to be completed during closure, by both staff and contractors.

Manager Johnson reviewed projections for 2025 that include an increase in membership and cart fees, rounds played, and cart fleet size, along with new sponsorship opportunities.

Following the presentation, the Board discussed opportunities for recognizing the environmental efforts of the golf course. Commissioner Seaman thanked staff for the presentation and the Board for their input. He referenced a financial spreadsheet and questioned whether the golf fund should receive money from the Recreation and General funds. Commissioner Seaman stressed the importance for ongoing discussions about the funding of Elder + Centennial and the golf course renovations.

NEW BUSINESS

Board Policy Manual Review Chapters 5-7

Office Associate Baker noted the numerous changes proposed for Chapters 5-7, and the addition of two new policies. Commissioner James offered comments for Chapter 5 and Commissioner Seaman suggested Chapters 6 and 7 be addressed by the finance advisory group. Following discussion, consensus was reached to channel Chapters 6 and 7 suggested edits through Commissioner Seaman.

Kenilworth-Winnetka Baseball Association Donation

Superintendent Berg reported the Kenilworth-Winnetka Baseball Association has offered to donate an outdoor portable fence for Field 3. An agreement was prepared to receive the

donation and outline the parameters. This donation enhances the District's sponsorship opportunities.

Zamboni Replacement

Executive Director Peterson commented on the proposed purchase of a new Zamboni. A memo will be presented for the purchase to be approved at the March 24, 2022 meeting.

MATTERS FROM THE DIRECTOR

Executive Director Peterson reported the Winnetka Platform Tennis Club affiliate agreement is complete and will be presented March 24, 2022 for Board approval. He, Superintendent Berg and Office Associate Baker attended the Illinois Association of Park Districts Legislative Conference in Springfield, and were fortunate to speak with several legislators.

BOARD LIAISON REPORTS

District 36 – Commissioner Rapp reported the school board thanked the District for their time and feedback on the Downsized Capital Improvement Plan. Responses are being prepared for the questions raised during the presentation.

Environmental & Forestry Commission – Commissioner Rapp reported the Village recently adopted the Chicago Region Climate Action Plan. The Commission is advancing positions on beach access as part of The Winnetka Futures 2040 Plan. Commissioner Rapp suggested the Board remain aware of the plan as certain aspects may affect the District.

Dog Beach/Dog Park – Commissioner Root reported about the March 3 Advisory Committee meeting. A subcommittee was formed and met March 7 to discuss communication strategies. The next committee meeting is scheduled for March 24. Commissioner Root and Superintendent Berg will do a walkthrough of the beach with a Lakota Group representative.

Parks Caucus – Commissioner Seaman reported the Spring Town Hall is scheduled for April 5 via Zoom.

Stormwater – Commissioner James reported he has spoken with Village President Rintz about the lack of financial resources to fund the golf course capital projects and the stormwater relocation at Elder. Commissioner James acknowledged the significant money the Village has received from the state.

Commissioner James reported Peter Tyor, a Caucus representative, would like to speak with the Board to promote a community-wide open house to engage residents and inform them of the volunteer opportunities available within the community. He will attend the March 24 Board meeting.

STAFF REPORTS

Kyle Berg, **Superintendent of Recreation** – reported registration opened March 1 for Winnetka residents to attend One Camp. Maximum enrollment was met. Enrollment will begin in April for Waukegan residents. Beach, boat and dog passes are on sale. The District 36 Facilities Committee will review the draft IGA in late March or early April and return it to the District with their comments. The 4th of July fireworks will be launched from the Public Works site and Fourthfest will be held at Village Green. Superintendent Berg announced the resignation of Marty Kwiatkowski. The position is under evaluation and should be filled shortly. He also reported a staff person has been hired to manage Lloyd Beach and the Stepan Family Boat Launch. Superintendent Berg shared highlights of his attendance at the Legislative Conference.

Jim Crocker, Superintendent of Finance – reported fieldwork for the audit will take place March 21-25. Revenue is currently above projections and expenses are below projections.

Costa Kutulas, **Director of Parks and Maintenance** – reported there will be a meeting soon with the Village to review the final stormwater plan designs. Bid specifications will be created soon. The plan design for Nick Corwin Park is being completed.

REVIEW OF ELDER + CENTENNIAL

Jon Shabica of Shabica & Associates, Inc. gave a power point presentation about the Lake Michigan shoreline, highlighting four key factors: dynamic and fluctuating Lake Michigan water levels, the effects of lakebed down cutting, sand movement/longshore transport challenges, and coastal structures. Photos and historical data were included.

Scott Freres of The Lakota Group gave a power point presentation of the existing beach conditions and the proposed beach and bluff access improvement plan for Elder + Centennial. Plan features include access and circulation, beachfront stabilization, and

erosion protection using a sustainable planting design.

*Commissioner Lussen joined the meeting at 5:54 p.m.

Commissioner James explained what the District learned from the Lloyd Beach renovation and how the information is being used to improve the design plan for Elder + Centennial. He specifically noted this plan is more economical, more environmental, more aesthetically pleasing, and provides additional safety protection.

Commissioner Root expressed her concern with the height of the proposed louvers and how they impair visual access. In response, Commissioner James, Mr. Freres and Mr. Shabica explained the louvers were chosen over other design options because of the visual access they provide while offering structural and design benefits as well as durability.

Commissioner Root noted the Waterfront 2030 plan does not include the lovers or planter pockets. Commissioner James further clarified several of the plan design features and suggested a resolution identifying findings and fact be prepared for the April committee meeting, have a formal consideration of all the information.

Commissioner Root requested the permit application documents be posted online. Commissioner James explained the documents would be posted once they have been finalized. He noted additional lakefront project documents would be posted as well for the public to review.

Director Kutulas shared a slide presentation and reviewed the phases of the Elder + Centennial construction implementation plan.

Commissioner Seaman stressed again the need for this project to be completed, recognizing the Board's responsibility to open Elder Lane Beach.

The fabricated louver design was on display for the Board and audience.

COMMUNICATIONS

STAFF UPDATES

Ania Cramer, Community Outreach/Business Development – reported she is pursuing private donors, private foundation grants, coastal grants, and is meeting with local legislators. The release of the OSLAD grants has been postponed until the 4th quarter.

Libby Baker, Office Associate – reported the proposed edits are being incorporated into Chapters 1–5.

Kyle Berg, Superintendent of Recreation – reported spring programs are underway; the focus is shifting to summer and staff recruitment. He attended a job fair at New Trier and will participate in the school's mock interview process. There is consideration to lower the

lifeguard age requirement to 15 to encourage additional applicants. The new Lloyd Beach manager will begin April 1. Staff is busy planning for Memorial Day and Fourth of July, with hopes to see a return of the Memorial Day parade.

Jim Crocker, Superintendent of Finance – reported the auditors were onsite this week to complete their field work; preliminary findings are favorable.

Costa Kutulas, Director of Parks & Maintenance – reported the final stormwater design reviews revisions are due to the Village tomorrow. The Village met recently with the Army Corps of Engineers and learned there may be an opportunity for a letter of "no objection". Removal of the ice rink is almost complete. Seasonal hiring is underway. Staff is finishing indoor projects and preparing for outside work. Nick Corwin Park playground removal is anticipated in June or July, followed by installation.

Commissioner Root reported on the March 23 meeting held via Zoom. Village President Rintz informed the committee the pier project is on hold; the project will be re-bid as the original bids received were extremely high. The committee hopes to have a formal presentation ready for the Board in May. An initial rendering was provided from The Lakota Group. The committee's communications team has developed several promotional

pieces. Concerned was expressed that the 2022 budget does not include money for developing a new dog beach, and inquired what will happen to their dog pass money and how is it accounted for. In response, Commissioner James expressed his feeling the dog beach is part of the overall Lakefront Masterplan, and should be budgeted for accordingly.

Parks Caucus

Commissioner Seaman reported the Annual Town Hall is scheduled for April 5. The Caucus Parks Committee met last night via Zoom. There are ten members. Work will begin on the survey. The Board should submit their thoughts to him and they will be shared with the Parks Committee.

Summary:

In 2014, with the support of its then park district member agencies, the Northern Suburban Special Recreation Association adopted the Partner Agency/NSSRA Employee Reciprocal Program and Facility Policy. In short, NSSRA's full-time employees and their immediate family members can choose to receive from one partner agency a limited scope of discounted programming and free programming for partner agency programs and facility use. Also, the reciprocal program provides partner agency full-time employees and their immediate family members with the opportunity to participate in NSSRA weekly programs free of charge.

Here is the policy within NSSRA's Benefits Manual:

NSSRA Benefits Manual

Section 4.7 Partner Agency/NSSRA Employee Reciprocal Program and Facility Policy Full-Time employees and their immediate family members (immediate family member defined as spouse/domestic partner and their children) may participate in NSSRA weekly programs free of charge. NSSRA maintains a reciprocal agreement with its partner agencies which allows all Full-Time employees of the partner agency and immediate family members to participate in NSSRA weekly programs free of charge. This agreement also allows NSSRA full-time staff and immediate family members to receive program discounts for partner agency programs and facilities. NSSRA full-time staff may choose no more than one partner agency to receive the program and facility discount offered by that chosen partner agency to their Full-Time employees. No discounts are provided for special events, overnight trips, camps, extended care programs (pre-school, adult day programs, afterschool, etc.) and other programs as deemed by NSSRA or partner agency. This policy will be reviewed annually by the NSSRA Board as part of the NSSRA budget process.

NSSRA suspended the reciprocal program mid-year 2020 through 2021 because of the pandemic. In December, 2021, Craig Culp (Executive Director; NSSRA) recommended to

the NSSRA board that the policy be reinstated; the NSSRA board voted to approve Executive Director Culp's recommendation. News of the reciprocal program has been positively received by NSSRA full-time staff and has enhanced NSSRA's wellness efforts for its employees. Executive Director Culp is now working to apply the program with each of the thirteen agencies supporting NSSRA.

For reference, below is a list of the partner agencies and the number of NSSRA staff using the member agency's facilities/programs in 2019:

Glenview – 5 Wilmette – 4 Deerfield – 3 Northbrook – 4

The Winnetka Park District has not participated in this program in the past. If approved by a member agency (in this case, the Winnetka Park District), NSSRA's Superintendent of Finance, George Pappas, will coordinate placement of staff equitably amongst all participating partner agencies.

Subject to support by the Winnetka Park District board, the one-year reciprocal program allows NSSRA and the Park District to finalize the program offerings and discuss the program at renewal to make adjustments as may be necessary.

Each Winnetka Park District business unit leader confirmed the discounted and free programs and services proposed for the program (see the attachment). The Park District's offerings are limited and do not bring upon the Park District any financial hardship and only involve a very nominal expense, if any. Given the above-referenced 2019 participation information, the NSSRA Employee Reciprocal Program and Facility Policy - - if supported by the Park District board - - will add a very small number of NSSRA employees and immediate family members to the overall group receiving discounted or free Winnetka Park District programs and services.

Recommendation:

Recognizing NSSRA is an extension of the Park District's overall program and service offerings, and in light of the information provided above, staff recommends approval of the NSSRA Employee Reciprocal Program and Facility Policy.

Proposed programs for use by the NSSRA employee(s) and her/his immediate family

<u>Hockey</u>

- Unlimited complimentary participation in the Winnetka Ice Arena Public Skate session (including skate rental).
- 50% discount in any group lesson class (hockey or figure skating), subject to availability.
- Three (3) opportunities to reserve the entire sheet of ice for a one-hour rental. Ice rental cost to be provided at a reduced price (non-prime pricing). Rental is subject to availability.

Platform Tennis

- Complimentary court rental for any day. Court rental is for two (2) hours, subject to availability.
- 50% discount for the price to participate in any group lesson class, subject to availability.
- Two (2) opportunities to rent the platform tennis hut at a reduced cost (50%). Facility rental is for a four (4) hour block of time and is subject to availability.

Recreation and Camps

- Resident rates to rent a Winnetka Park District park facility space (Crow Island covered shelter, Indian Hill Park warming hut, birthday party rooms, etc.).
- One (1) complimentary beach season pass and parking sticker for the Winnetka Park District swimming beaches (currently Tower Road Beach and Maple Street Beach) for a family of four. Should the NSSRA employee have a family larger than four members in total, the Winnetka Park District will work to develop a tailored solution.
- Complimentary registration for a limited scope of recreation programming directly managed by the Winnetka Park District. This includes free events (Wednesdays in the Woods concerts, etc.), holiday programs, and sports programming directly managed by the Park. This does not include the Park District summer camp programs, holiday break camp programs, or programs run by third party affiliates, such as Kenilworth Winnetka Baseball Association, North Shore Trevians Football, Sports Made Personal soccer and lacrosse programs, and AYSO soccer programs.

<u>Golf</u>

- One (1) complimentary weekday greens fee each month for the nine-hole Par 3 course <u>or</u> the 18-hole championship course, subject to availability. Golf carts fees are not included.
- Unlimited use of the driving range (free buckets of range golf balls).

<u>Tennis</u>

- Unlimited complimentary use of the outdoor tennis courts, subject to court availability. Walk-on play is permitted and reservations are allowed; the reservation can only be booked within 48 hours of court use.
- 50% discount of the resident rate for one (1) group tennis program each year, if space is available. A group tennis program is comprised of multiple one-hour group lessons per program. The number of group lessons in a program varies (three to ten lessons).
- Three (3) complimentary indoor tennis court rental sessions, subject to court availability. A court reservation is not required but strongly suggested; a reservation can only be booked within 48 hours of court use.
